- 1. Entries in the Senior Dairy Goats are open to the world. Placer County Senior Dairy Goat entries have priority over the adjoining communities when space is limited to 200 animals and received on a first come, first served basis.
- 2. Registered animals only. Only animals with a "Certificate of Registry" issued by the American Dairy Goat Association are eligible.
- 3. This show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern, provided they do not conflict with any of the rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture.
- 4. Exhibitors will be allowed three (3) does in one class, State Rule IV-6 to prevail.
- 5. Limit of two (2) entries per exhibitor in group classes.
- 6. The Junior and Senior Dairy Goat classes are not separately sanctioned by A.D.G.A.
- 7. Entry forms that are not complete will be charged \$5 penalty fee. All required information and the penalty fee must be received by June 14th!
- 8. Pens **MUST** be cleaned prior to departure!
- 9. Substitutions can only be made within a division. A \$5.00 penalty must be paid prior to judging for each substitution made by exhibitor in excess of two in the division.

Floriculture Local Rules

1. Floriculture will be brought to, judged, and displayed in the Garden Room.
2. All entries must be entered on official forms furnished by the Entry Office. Exhibitors must have all entries in place on the days and at the times designated throughout the schedule. All Floriculture exhibits are to be picked up on Monday June 29, 2009 between the hours of 3:00 to 6:30 p.m. by claim ticket only.
3. State Rule IV-6 applies.
4. Entry fees must accompany entry forms.
5. Each exhibit must be accurately and correctly labeled under the proper class number, even though they are the same type flower. (Example: Two entries of a red rose must be listed separately due to the fact that each must have an identity tag.)
6. Containers are provided by the Fair for the cut flowers. Use your own vase where it specifies "Bouquets" or flowers to be floated. Please mark all your belongings.
7. Management reserves the right to remove and discard all cut flowers at the close of each entry period.
8. Responsibility: See State Rules number 11-15, 16 and 17.
9. Judges may reserve the right to disqualify or transfer to correct class (at his or her discretion) any entry entered in the wrong class or division and any exhibit which is not a true representative of the class or division in which it is entered.
10. Specimens with aphids, etc. will be disqualified.
11. Flowers and plant material should be well hardened and groomed. **LEAVES WHICH WILL BE BELOW WATER MUST BE REMOVED.**
12. Exhibits in the Floriculture Department, except arrangements, must have been grown by exhibitor. All classes are open to legal residents or producers in El Dorado, Placer, Nevada, Sacramento, Sutter and Yuba counties.
13. No entry will be accepted where an exhibitor prescribes conditions under which he or she will exhibit.

"Glossary"

- ANNUAL** – A plant that completes its outdoor cycle of growth in one year.
- BIENNIAL** – A plant that normally completes its outdoor cycle of growth in two years.
- PERENNIAL** – A plant that lives, blooms, and seeds for more than two years. Trees and shrubs are hard wooded perennials.
- HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS** – A plant that lives longer than two years but which in colder climates dies back to the ground each winter.
- SPIKE** – A flower structure with flowers, stemless or very short stemmed, on a common lengthened stalk. Example: Gladiolus.
- SPRAY** – Portion of a plant with a number of flowers on one stem. Example: Cosmos.
- STEM** – The main ascending part of a plant. Example: Tea Rose, Carnation.
- STALK** – A stiff stem which may or may not branch, and with one or more flowers and bulbs. Example: Tall Bearded Iris.
- BLOOM** – Individual flowers, one blossom on a stem. Example: Carnations.
- SPECIMEN** – A single plant, bloom, spike, spray, stalk or stem.

8. No entries will be released prior to Monday, June 29th at 3:00 p.m. Present claim stubs when picking up entries.

1. Entries open to legal residents of El Dorado, Placer, Nevada, Sacramento, Sutter and Yuba counties.
2. Bases and mats permitted with all exhibits and accessories permitted in all classes unless otherwise stated.
3. Plant material on the State Conservation list may not be exhibited.
4. All entries must contain fresh plant material, unless otherwise specified. Fresh plant material includes flowers, foliage, branches, fruits, vegetables, and succulents. Fresh plant material must not be sprayed, dyed, painted, etc. Fruits and vegetables must not be cut open. Dried materials may be treated (i.e., sprayed, waxed, painted, dyed, etc.). Imitation or artificial plant materials (including silk flowers) will not be permitted unless otherwise specified.
5. Material used need not be grown by exhibitor.
6. In Advanced and Masters Division, exhibitors desiring special background must provide support for same.
7. No arrangements to occupy more than approximately two (2) feet of table space, except horizontal classes.
8. Flowers and plant materials should be well conditioned and groomed.
9. Exhibitors must complete and clean area after each arrangement is placed.
10. Silk flower arrangements cannot have any fresh plant material. They must remain for the duration of the Fair.
11. Titles for each class are simply to stimulate your imagination and should not be taken literally.
12. Use of clay or other sticky materials to anchor any portion of a design to shelves or table SHALL CANCEL any award made. All construction and backgrounds must be self-supporting.
13. Arrangements: Read carefully and select the division equal to your ability of designing:
 - a. NOVICE: One who has won not more than 10 blue ribbons in any organized flower show.
 - b. AMATEUR: One who has won 10 to 15 blue ribbons in any organized flower show, and is not, or has not been engaged in Flower Arranging as a teacher or lecturer, or operated as a commercial enterprise.
 - c. ADVANCED: An Amateur who has won more than 15 blue ribbons may enter Advanced or Masters.
 - d. MASTER'S DIVISION: Open to advanced arrangers, student judges, accredited judges, instructors and lecturers.
 - e. PROFESSIONAL FLORIST: Open to persons or organizations conducting an established business or allied with a florist.
 - f. GROUP ARRANGEMENTS: The purpose of this division is to tell the story of new trends and contemporary styles. The space for exhibits is approximately 10 feet. A display of multiple arrangements is judged as one unit.
14. Materials or exhibits in a given class will not be permitted to compete in any other class any other day.
15. Floriculture Local Rules also apply to Arrangements divisions.
