1. Senior Beef Cattle Divisions will be open to the State of California with priority given to the residents of Placer, El Dorado, Sacramento, Sutter, Yuba and Nevada counties as space allows. Residents of Placer County must submit their entries prior to May 18th to receive preference over exhibitors from outside the County. Entries will be accepted until the facilities are filled or May 29th.
2. Registered animals only. Registration must be from recognized Breed Association.
3. Nurse cows will not be permitted on fairgrounds.
4. The American System of judging will be used.
5. Only two (2) entries per exhibitor per class.

- 13 Junior Get-of-Sire: Three animals, summer yearlings or younger, get of same bull, both sexes to be represented.
- 14 Pair of Females: Two females, bred by exhibitor.
- 15 Cow/Calf: Any registered breed specified with calf at side, born on or after September 1, 2008 The calf must be cow's natural calf, not an embryo transplant. Must be eligible for registration. It is recommended that the judge give the calf approximately 50 percent of his consideration when placing the class. If the calf is under six months of age, it must be nursing. If calf is over six months of age, it must have registration papers. No exceptions! One entry per exhibitor. Only one entry fee is required.

1. Senior Sheep Divisions will be open to the State of California with priority given to the residents of Placer, El Dorado, Sacramento, Sutter, Yuba and Nevada counties as space allows. Residents of Placer County must submit their entries prior to May 18th to receive preference over exhibitors from outside the County. Entries will be accepted until the facilities are filled or May 29th.
2. Registered animals only in Divisions 108-113. Registered in the American Breeder's Association of each breed is required.
3. Flock numbers shall be used to identify all entries.
4. Numbers shall be on regular and practical tags attached to the ear or tattooed in the ear.
5. An exhibitor may not use the same flock number on more than one animal during any two (2) consecutive calendar years.
6. Registration numbers may not be used as flock numbers.
7. Flock numbers and breeder's initials, name or association prefix shall be on regular and practical tags attached to the ear or tattooed in the ear for yearlings and lambs bred by the exhibitor.
8. Lambs must show lamb's teeth.
9. Note: Breeding animals born before January 2, 2002 are exempt from State Rule IX-Sheep-1.
10. Early and late Spring Lamb classes may be combined.
11. Limit of two (2) entries per exhibitor in group classes.
12. Animals entered in Divisions 114 and 115 are not eligible to enter registered divisions.

- 1. Entries in the Senior Dairy Goats are open to the world. Placer County Senior Dairy Goat entries have priority over the adjoining communities when space is limited to 200 animals and received on a first come, first served basis.
- 2. Registered animals only. Only animals with a "Certificate of Registry" issued by the American Dairy Goat Association are eligible.
- 3. This show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern, provided they do not conflict with any of the rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture.
- 4. Exhibitors will be allowed three (3) does in one class, State Rule IV-6 to prevail.
- 5. Limit of two (2) entries per exhibitor in group classes.
- 6. The Junior and Senior Dairy Goat classes are not separately sanctioned by A.D.G.A.
- 7. Entry forms that are not complete will be charged \$5 penalty fee. All required information and the penalty fee must be received by June 14th!
- 8. Pens MUST be cleaned prior to departure!
- 9. Substitutions can only be made within a division. A \$5.00 penalty must be paid prior to judging for each substitution made by exhibitor in excess of two in the division.
