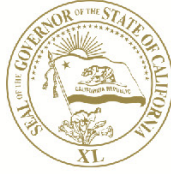

Credentials, Passes, & Admission

Each livestock exhibitor will be given one 4-day admission wristband to the Placer County Fair. Each exhibitor's family will be given an additional wristband and one parking pass, both good for all four days, to the Placer County Fair. Wristbands and parking passes will be available to pick up during receiving dates and times listed for each category. **PARKING PASSES MUST BE DISPLAYED AT ALL TIMES WHEN PARKING IN G OR H LOT.** Additional wristbands will be available for purchase for \$20. Only immediate family are eligible for discounted wristbands. Wristbands must be worn during the entirety of the fair.

Carnival Bonus

Livestock exhibitors may purchase a 4-day carnival wristband for \$80 for unlimited carnival rides. This wristband is good for all opening hours of the Fair, Thursday through Sunday. The deadline to purchase the wristbands for \$80 is Tuesday, June 18th at 5 PM.

Still Exhibit Entry

All livestock exhibitors are **required** to enter at least one entry into the Still Exhibit competition. Applications are due by Friday, May 31st at 11:59 PM. Entries are free for all youth 18 and under (age 19 if an exhibitor is a 4-H/FFA/Independent member).

How can I enter?

At the beginning of each department page is information relative to that competition. This information includes eligibility requirements, entry deadline, delivery/pick up information and judging schedule.

When is the entry deadline?

Entry forms & fees must be received online through ShoWorks before 11:59 PM on Thursday, May 16, 2024.

Where do I turn in my entry form and fees?

You are required to enter online through our **ShoWorks Online** entry system.

All entries must be submitted online before the deadline. No paper entries will be accepted in the Fair office.

Livestock Categories

Placer County Fair Livestock Rules

The Junior Livestock Auction will be held Saturday, June 22, 2024 at 10:00 AM in the Livestock Pavilion. Junior Market Animals and Replacement Females must be weighed in on Tuesday, June 18, 2024 from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM!

Official Rules

1. Exhibitors must have been a member of FFA, 4-H, or Grange Project prior to January 1, 2023.
2. 4-H, FFA, and Grange members must be in good standing with their respective organizations to be eligible to enter and show at the Placer County Fair.
3. Independent Exhibitors must show proof of eligibility and will be entered into the classes that correspond to their school grade, 4-8 graders will show with 4-H and exhibitors in high school will show in FFA classes.
4. The Fair Management reserves the right to limit entries due to available space in the barns.
5. Each exhibitor will be allowed to sell only one (1) market entry regardless of species: One (1) Market Beef or one (1) Replacement Heifer, or one (1) Market Hog or one (1) Replacement Gilt, or one (1) Market Lamb or one (1) Replacement Ewe, or one (1) Market Goat or one (1) Replacement Doe, or one (1) pen of 3 Rabbits or one (1) Single Fryer Rabbit, One (1) Dozen Market Eggs, (2) Ducks or (2) Chickens.
 - a. Animals eligible for the sale **MUST BE** declared within one hour of the conclusion of the show. All declarations must be made when pictures are taken, or when the last market animal is shown. If no animal is declared, then no animal will be added to the sale.
 - b. Exhibitors will have one hour after the posting of the Sale Order to contest any mistake in animal declarations.
6. Exhibitors, and Parents are required to sign an adult code of conduct form. Anyone found in violation of rules or in practices deemed unethical or inimical with the Placer County Fair shall be penalized by forfeiture of premiums awarded and/or privileges as may be deemed appropriate to the circumstances, including ineligibility to participate at future Placer County Fairs and/ or Junior Livestock Auctions.
7. All sale animals, except for poultry and rabbits, must have been pre-weighed (replacement animals are not required to weigh but must be tagged) and ear tagged at the designated pre-weigh in dates. Pictures may be taken at the time of weigh in with ear tags in the animal ears.
8. An official Placer County Fair ear tag/tattoo is required on all market animals from the time of weigh-in to the release of animals on Sunday, June 26. All other identification tags will be removed at the scales (except for Jr. Grand National CYAE or California State Fair ear tags and scrapie tags.)
9. An exhibitor is only allowed to weigh in (3) three animals per species at pre-weigh in.
10. Animals must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor for the following minimum length of time prior to the Placer County Fair:

Beef	150 days
Sheep, Swine & Goats	60 days

Small Animals 30 days

a. Family Backup Animal: Definition of "family." A family back-up animal can only be used by an immediate family member by marriage, birth, or adoption. Each family member using the same family back-up animal must properly enter it and pay the appropriate entry fee prior to the entry deadline.

11. Exhibitors must care for their animals until departure from the Fairgrounds or they will forfeit all awards, auction monies and eligibility at future Placer County Fairs. There is zero tolerance regarding exhibitor and parent conduct.

12. Official Weighmasters will be provided. No Pre-Weighing of animals is permitted. If a weight is contested, re-weigh must be requested at the scale immediately. The animal in question will be removed from the scale, the scale will be re-balanced, and the animal will again be weighed. Under no circumstances shall the animal leave the scale area. Underweight market animals entered in a market class will automatically drop to a feeder class, overweight feeder animals may NOT move up to a market class. Three (3) feeder entries (per species) are allowed per exhibitor. If an animal does not make weight, no replacements are allowed.

13. There are to be no private scales on the grounds. Excessive exercise of a market animal for the purpose of weight reduction is forbidden on the Fairgrounds. Excessively wet animals will be disqualified by the Weigh Master.

14. PAY WEIGHT LIMITS. There will be no top weights on the following species, and the top pay weights for sale purposes are as follows:

Beef = 1500 lbs. Sheep = 150 lbs. Goats = 100 lbs.

Maximum weight for all market hogs is 300 lbs. Minimum Weight is 220 lbs. Hogs weighing above 300 lbs. will be disqualified from market classes and the Junior Livestock Auction but may remain in Showmanship and will be moved into the Progress Class.

15. The Placer County Fair requires exhibitors of all market and replacement animals to complete a Medication Declaration Form for each animal brought to the scale for official weigh-in.

16. Market Beef Exhibitors must furnish a Bill of Sale and/or official Brand Inspection form to the State Brand Inspector. A Brand Inspection or an out billing from an auction yard must be made out to the exhibitor, showing proof of 150 days ownership, or a signed statement declaring the animal was bred and raised by the exhibitor.

17. No junior exhibitor may exhibit a market animal which has been sold through a Fair Junior Livestock Auction whether or not there is an actual change of ownership.

18. Large Animals: A minimum of five entries per division must be judged in order for a Champion and Reserve Champion award to be given.

Small Animals: A minimum of five entries per division (Breed & Market Classes) must be judged in order for a Champion and Reserve Champion award to be given, unless deemed by the judge to receive the Champion and/or Reserve Champion title.

19. All Champions and Reserves must sell. Only in the instance that an exhibitor is awarded both a

Champion and/or a Reserve Champion will an exhibitor be allowed to sell more than 1 animal.

20. Only animals deemed worthy by the judge and declared market ready/acceptable will be allowed to sell in the Junior Livestock Auction.

21. Market lambs must be slick shorn within 10 days of the opening day of the Fair.

22. Primary members are not eligible to sell.

23. All animals eligible for the sale must be shown as individuals in their respective classes and will be selected at the judge's discretion. Animals will be placed in sale order by official show clerks based upon the judge's direction.

24. All exhibitors of sale animals must be present in the official uniform when pictures are taken for buyer's photographs. This picture is a requirement for sale of the animal.

25. The Sale Order will be posted at the Livestock Entry Office. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to check this list immediately upon posting and report any changes to the Livestock Entry Office. Corrections must be made at the time posted by the Livestock Entry Office. You will have one hour after it's posted to find any mistakes. After that, once mistakes are fixed, the sale order will be FINAL.

26. A substitute handler to sell the animal will be allowed only after approval from Placer County Fair Management. The exhibitor must present to Fair Management a written request to have another eligible exhibitor sell their animal. The substitute exhibitor must appear in full uniform of his/her respective organization (4-H, FFA or Grange). This request must be provided to management 10 days prior to auction day, unless emergency situation does not allow.

27. All market and replacement animals sold will be charged a 7% commission and add-ons, 3% commission.

28. The Junior Livestock Auction Committee will be responsible for shipping of all sale animals.

29. All animals sold in the auction must go to the designated processing plant as determined by the Junior Livestock Auction Committee. Market steers and Market Lambs will go to the designated processing plant to be eligible for the carcass contest. The Junior Livestock Auction is a Terminal Sale for all Market Animals apart from Replacement Females.

30. Sellers of market lambs and market goats are financially responsible for animals which are rejected at the processing center due to the presence of scrapie.

31. Condition of Sale Animals: Only natural colored paint is to be allowed (beef). No other painting or decorations on animals is allowed. All sale animals must be in show-groom condition when entering the sale ring, or the animal will be disqualified from the Junior Livestock Auction.

32. No artificial hair-like substance or coloring changes will be permitted. No icing, slapping, drenching, or muzzling will be permitted. All animals are always subject to inspection by the official Fair veterinarian. All animals will be inspected prior to entering the ring.

Placer County Fair Livestock Rules

33. Exhibitors will not be allowed to ask the person who buys their animal to give or sell it back to the exhibitor. Exhibitors may not offer to trade another animal that was not sold in the auction to the buyer for the sale animal.

34. Sale Order for the 2023 Junior Livestock Auction will be done on a rotational basis as follows: All Animals will be sold by species will not be split in half. All Small Animals and replacements will be sold by the Lot not by the pound.

35. Failure to observe the Junior Livestock Auction Rules may result in the animal being excluded from the sale.

36. In the event that an exhibitor receives an overpayment in premium or sale monies, the exhibitor is responsible for returning the overpayment to the Placer County Fair. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of eligibility at future Placer County Fairs.

37. Checks for the sale of animals will be available at the Placer County Fair Administration Office beginning Friday, July 19, 2024, between the hours of 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Friday. Exhibitors must present a "Thank You" letter for their buyer to the Fair office, in a stamped, sealed envelope.

Adult Code of Conduct

As the parent, guardian, leader, or advisor of an animal exhibitor in the Placer County Fair:

I believe my child should demonstrate his or her own ability, knowledge, and skill as a feeder, fitter and show person of a show animal. I understand that parents, siblings, and leaders may assist their child/sibling except in any activity that enhances the placement of the animal while at the fair.

I will ensure that my child follows the competition rules, and does not use abusive, questionable, or unethical techniques in the feeding, caring, fitting, or showing of any animals. I will ensure that my child does not resort to fraudulent, illegal, or deceptive practices while fitting or preparing the animal for show and will follow withdrawal protocol.

I have read and understand all of the rules and regulations found in the Livestock Handbook.

I realize that my child is responsible for:

- The proper care and humane treatment of animals before, during, and after exhibition and sale.
- The production of wholesome food when the exhibit animal is designated for market.

I will conduct myself at all times to be a credit to my child's organization, chapter, club, school, community, and family. I will follow proper procedures and chain of command if there is a conflict. **I will not post negative comments or conflicts on social media.**

I am aware that **responsible alcohol use** is allowed on the fairgrounds and I will limit my use of alcohol so that I set a proper example for my child and the children of others around me. I shall ensure that other adults are equally responsible in the use of alcohol around my child. I shall not use any drugs that are considered illegal at the federal, state or local level while on the fairgrounds.

I understand that direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect. I will not allow any person connected with my child's project to direct abusive or threatening conduct toward any show official. Protest rules can be found in the State Rules for California fairs at www.cdffs.ca.gov/fe.

I understand and agree that if I, my child, my child's supervisor or leader or any other adult or minor connected with my child's project or animal(s) break the rules, I will accept the final decision of the Placer County Fair Management regarding the disqualification of my child and or the animal, the loss of prizes, the forfeiture of auction participation, loss of future eligibility, and forfeiture of any monetary award(s).

I understand that my minor child will not stay overnight @the Grounds without their parent or guardian present.

I accept that these entries are subject to the rules and regulations as published in the official Livestock Handbook. I further declare that all statements made in connection with my child's entries are true.

I will remember that children participate to have fun and that the competition is for the benefit of youth, not adults.

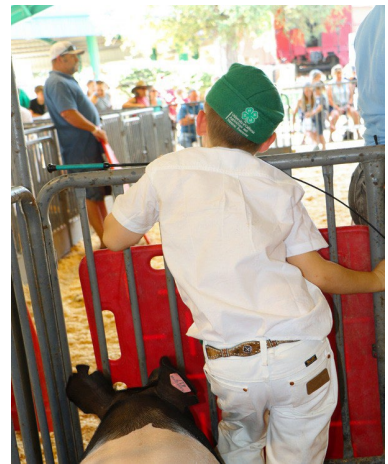

Market Animal Score Cards

Score Card Details

The JLA and Fair Management hire quality judges. Score cards are used as a tool by judges. However, all judging is subjective. It is that person's opinion that day. Market readiness is determined by the judge.

BEEF:

- Market Ready – Market Beef projected to have sufficient fat deposition to meet the marbling specifications for USDA Prime or Choice or Select + quality grades.
- Non-Market Ready – Market Beef lacking evidence of sufficient fat deposition to produce a desirable consumer product. A steer projected to grade USDA Select – or lower.

SWINE:

- Market Ready – U.S. Number 1 and Number 2 hogs of average or greater conformation that are acceptable in leanness, muscularity and production traits.
- Non-Market Ready – Any Hog of below average conformation including U.S. Number 3, U.S. Number 4 and utility grade hogs.

SHEEP:

- Market Ready – USDA Prime or Choice quality with 12th rib back fat range of .16 to .35, average or greater conformation and cutability.
- Non-Market Ready – Good or lower quality grade with 12th rib back fat range of <.16 or >.35; under finished lambs grading USDA good or lower, below average conformation or cutability.

GOATS:

- Market Ready – USDA Prime or Choice quality with 12th rib back fat range of .08 to .12 most desirable, .13 to .22 back fat acceptable, average or greater conformation and cutability.
- Non-Market Ready – Good or lower quality grade with 12th rib back fat range of <.08 or >.22; under finished goats grading USDA good or lower, below average conformation or cutability.

- Pee Wee Showmanship is only offered for large livestock. Small livestock will be offered as primary classes.
- The Exhibitor is responsible for finding an animal to show that is currently on-site. If the animal deemed too dangerous for the exhibitor and/or other Exhibitors, the Exhibitor will be disqualified.
